





2023 Overview

- 2023 Revenues in-line with expectations
- Various expenses below estimates as of 10/31 (e.g. Field rentals and referees)

2024 Budget Considerations

Maximize player experience and development

- Maintain break/even approach
- Retain, attract and hire top quality coaches; emphasis on girls program
- Continue prudent expense management
- Uphold/increase support for players of families experiencing hardship

- BISD led with DA Hogan as contractor
- Ready for BISD and BIFC to use on 11/22!
- Portable lights



Woodward - Phase 2

- Turfing adjoining grass field at Woodward
- Permanent lighting for both fields
- BISD finalizing plan and package to submit to the City to initiate permitting process includes public comment and meetings
- Goal is to complete Phase 2 and have fields and lighting in place for next fall/winter
- BIFC has made a commitment to support fundraising for Phase 2 and will be staring our campaign soon



Confidential Reporting



New confidential reporting via our website

Reports can be made anonymously

Reports go to club president, vice president, secretary, and safety officer



Conduct Review

We have formalized our processes for conduct review:

- Conduct Review Board: board members and club safety officer
- CRB members perform fact finding and propose corrective action if needed
- CRB actions must be reported to the entire BIFC Board and safety officer
- Centralized, persistent record-keeping



Hiring & Onboarding

Finalized Employee Handbook

Formalizing Our Hiring Process:

- DOC to identify potential coaching slate
- A hiring committee including TD, President and VP Select review and approve hires
- President will check internal conduct review records as additional safeguard to the background check

Training

Current training (every year)

- Safesport
- Safety (Concussion & Sudden Cardiac Arrest)
- Positive Coaching (new for 2024)
